Quilt Show 2024 is quickly coming up! This is the guild's biggest activity of the last two years and it is the most important one that we open to our community. Not only are we sharing our

art, but we are also sharing ourselves as guild representatives. We hope this encourages others to join us. The show is a long three days with a multitude of activities. The only way in which we can accomplish this is by depending on all members to actively take part in helping out. We want to make this show the best yet!

Everyone to attend committee meetings. The next meeting will be at 5:00 pm Wednesday, March 20, at Raydene's house, 4453 Eyelet Court.

- **Sponsorships:** Putting on the Quilt Show is expensive, and Centennial Hall is our largest expense. One important offset that is helping with our costs is sponsorships from local businesses and individuals. The deadline for sponsorships is 5 pm, Monday, March 18, 2024. - Sales table: Please return your ornaments (or kits) to Laurie Adamson. We need donations of quilting items and small handi-crafts to sell. People love to buy hand-made items.
- Auction table: Please consider donating something for the silent auction. Maybe you have a quilt kit you aren't going to get around to making or a wall-hanging you no longer have room for? Please see Marcie Benvin for donations. Most of our show revenue usually comes from these items.
- **Displays:** We are featuring "Alaskan "quilts your interpretation in the display area this year separate from the judged quilting area. There is a form on the website to attach to these display quilts. Like last time, Centennial Hall does not have enough pipe & drape for us to fill this space. We would like to borrow member's quilt racks and ladders to allow us to display those quilts. Raydene is the contact for questions.
- Members' Live Demonstrations: We forget that most members of the public have a limited knowledge of quilting. The educational component of the show is a highlight for many! We are asking for short, two-hour demonstration slots for members to show the public a bit about a quilting component. Have a quilt to bind? Sit at the show and demonstrate. Working on a wool applique? Bring it to the show. People are fascinated by the "Pieces" that go into making a quilt. Bring something and visit with the community. See Laurie Adamson to sign-up.
- Member Biography Form: We are asking all members to fill out a short biography form if you don't already have one (even if you're not entering a quilt in the show). These forms are available to download on the website, and Marcie can help with questions. We want our community to not only see our work but to know a bit about us! We received a lot of feedback at the last show from members and from the community saying how much they enjoyed learning about us and how we've come to quilting. If you are completing it at home, please bring it to the meeting so it can be included in our Member Book.

- Display honoring members who have passed since the last show: Marcie is looking for information and items from Valerie Horner, Lynne Gregg, Judy Cole and MaryAnn Vaughan.
- Entry form: The Quilt Show entry form is up on our website and ready for your entries! After you submit your form, the information will be used to populate the quilt description that is posted with the quilt for the public. You must have all of the following information to enter your quilt as none of the questions can be skipped. In addition, you might want to print a copy of your entry prior to pushing the send button if you do it on the fly like I do. (I always want the form back to see what I wrote in the description.) The deadline to enter quilts is April 10! Marcie Benvin and Karen Paulick will bring their computers to the meeting Saturday to help members input their forms if needed. You will need the following information to input your quilt: 1-personal info (your name, address and phone number), 2-name of quilt, 3-length of quilt, 4-width of quilt, 5-who quilted it, 6-in what quilting manner, 7-if quilted professionally, who quilted it; 8-category, 9-description of quilt, and 10-credit the source of the quilt pattern design. WE NEED YOUR QUILTS!
- Sleeves: All quilts must have at least a 4" sleeve for hanging. The sleeve does not have to be permanent. It can be pinned sturdily or whip stitched to the back of the quilt for easy removal after the show.
- WE NEED YOUR HELP!!! VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED FOR ALL THREE DAYS OF SHOW! Please sign up to help daily if you are able. Laurie Adamson has the list of volunteers.
- Quilt Labels: All quilt entries must have a label. Quilt labels don't have to be
 elaborate or fancy. They should include the name of your quilt (or pattern), who made
 it, who quilted it, and when you finished it. Here are some examples:





Based on 71 members, our quorum is 24 members.

President Ann called the meeting to order at 10:34 am.

Minutes: Geri Fudge moved we approve the November and January minutes. Karen Smith seconded. Approved both sets of minutes.

Treasurer's report: Debbie presented the information which is posted at the end of the minutes due to the PDF formatting which takes an entire page.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

April 13-14 Quilt Sampler: Over two days, a number of mini-tutorials will be presented that we can either watch live or within the next day or two. Ann will sign us up; a vote is not needed.

Comfort Quilts: Ann opened a package from Eagle River that had a comfort quilt in it that she had made. The family who returned it said it provided comfort to their family member, and they wanted to return it to us. Judy Morley reported that last month she left five quilts at oncology and four at the hospital. This month, she has given five more to oncology. At this time, she has none left that are finished. Shannon said she had dropped a bunch off at Judy's house. Judy will see if Bruce put them somewhere.

Pillowcases: Shannon has updated all the contacts. AWARE (Laura 586-6623x331) took 50 pillowcases and will call when they need more. JYC (Lori King 523-6835) took 25 and will call when they need more. If anyone is interested in teaching the girls how to sew, let Shannon know. She will be making curtains for the windows in the doors; they must be made out of denim, and the pattern is specific. Housing First (Lehua 500-7345) would like two pillowcases for their starter kits. The Pioneer Home (Josielind 780-6422x212) is very excited about the prospects of having pillowcases provided for their residents. They need 49; she has 35 completed. Josielind is their recreation therapist. Please contact her if you're interested in going to the Pioneer Home to sew. Neither JAMHI nor CAC returned Shannon's calls.

After today's meeting we will be sewing pillow cases today. Shannon has the fabrics separated so the adult-ish fabrics are on the right. We need many for men. She asked that we take kits home if we can't stay today. She thinks all the kits upstairs have been brought down here. We are also welcome and encouraged to go through our stashes and donate manly fabrics.

QUILT SHOW: Raydene reported that entry forms are now online. We owe a big thanks to Karen Paulick and Marcie Benvin for all their work! April 10th is the deadline to enter your

quilts. Both Marcie and Karen brought their computers today to help you enter your quilts. You need to have all your quilt information at your fingertips when entering a quilt for the show as all of the blanks must be filled in. If you have questions, please call either Marcie or Karen. All the information on the entry form will go into how quilts will be hung and will help with judging.

Sponsor forms, special display forms and the member bio forms are also online.

Laurie has the volunteer sign up sheets. We hope you can help in multiple ways on more than one day. As of today, we have received sponsor checks from: HECLA-Greens Creek, NAO, Annie Kaill's, Shoe Fly; Dr. Mindy Shaw, DDS; and Changing Tides. When you shop with our sponsors or see them, please thank them.

The show is free to the public.

Raydene brought up a question that recently came surfaced. When we voted last spring, the GROUP CATEGORY was worded to state that the names on the quilt must be members in good standing. An inconsequential result of the wording is that any group quilt cannot be entered in this category if any of those who are on the quilt were members who have died or have moved and are no longer members. When asked, Debbie said we do have records of membership for each year. The quilt in question is from 2016, and all the names on the quilt were members in good standing during that year. Amy Kesten added that one of the names on that quilt is out of the country and not a current member. Debbie said she could accept the quilt if a member has passed away. Raydene said she has a quilt from years ago that has names on it who moved away years ago. She said she wouldn't expect those people to maintain their membership here. Raydene moved that the Group Category be amended to say that the owner/maker of the quilt must be a current member in good standing, and all the quilt makers must have been members in good standing at the time the quilt was started. Amy seconded. Marcie asked if this applied to only the Group Category and was assured that is the case. It was also noted that any quilt can be entered in the non-judged Serendipity category. Geri Fudge asked about the change in wording. Sandra said it originally came up, because a quilt was entered in one show where not all the quilt makers were guild members/did not live in Alaska/had never been guild members. Sandi Benzel asked if changing the wording included the longarmer who quilts the quilt. She was assured that the change in wording has nothing to do with the quilting of the quilt. The wording change is specific to the names on the quilt label who either are or were guild members when the guilt was made. Motion passed.

Karen Paulick has paper forms here and the list of categories. Both are also online under the Members Only section of our webpage. They are under the Forms category or under the Quilt Show category.

Marcie didn't print the Silent Auction forms, and the form is not currently online. Marcie is looking for small quilts or projects that would sell for more than if they were on the sale table. Kits may also be donated. In the past, we have also had treadle machines and other antiques up for the silent auction.

Laurie Adamson is accepting items/donations for the sales table. She found a pattern for pan protectors in three sizes and made them up with different linings. They would make nice items for the sales table. Sandra said the new pans that David bought came with protectors. Laurie added that she has more ornament kits if you are interested in making more. The sales and auction tables will be using the Square for transactions. Judy Morley's husband, Bruce, made 60-ish quilt hangers for the sales table that can be hung with Command Strips.

Marcie is looking for photos and/or memorabilia on members we would like to remember who have passed since our last quilt show: Val Horner, Judy Cole, Lynne Gregg and Maryann Vaughan.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

UFOs: UFOs are due at or before the March meeting. If your quilt is finished, Sandra needs to see it completed. If you did not get it finished, bring your checkbook or cash to the meeting.

Retreat: We had a blast! Six of us went to the Jubilee Cabin at the Shrine of St. Therese and worked on and finished a lot of projects. It was beautiful out there! Ann is proposing our next retreat at the Shrine for October 3-7, but their calendar is not yet open for those dates. There's room out there for more than six quilters.

New members are welcome year-round!

By-laws committee: Ann asked for volunteers to help review our bylaws. Ann Lind, Debbie Germain, Amy Kesten and Karen Smith volunteered. Ann will get the information out. Raydene suggested the committee also look at our Standing Rules.
