### **GUILD COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS: Pillowcases and comfort quilts**

**Pillowcases:** Shannon Dilley currently heads up our pillowcase project. We regularly donate to AWARE, JYC (incarcerated youth), Housing First and the Pioneer Home. We have pillowcase kits upstairs at the church or you can make some from your stash. The burrito method is a tried and true method with instructions on our website. We hope to soon sponsor a class on making pillowcases by serger/overlocker. Please keep in mind that our website states all pillowcases must have encased/closed seams ... so little (or big) fingers can't pull them apart.

**Comfort quilts:** Judy Morley continues to keep us on track with comfort quilts for area cancer patients. Like the pillowcase kits, we have kits of fabric upstairs at the church with 3-yard patterns enclosed. You can take a kit and make one of the 3-yard quilts in just a few hours, or you're welcome to raid your stash to put something together on your own. Generally, a comfort quilt is a lap quilt that is 50ish inches by 60ish inches, but Judy accepts both larger and smaller quilt tops for quilting and donating. The Guild supplies the batting and backing. Judy quilts the tops and returns them to us at a membership meeting where one of us takes our quilt (or someone else's) to bind and label.

**UFOs:** UFO = UnFinished Object. It could be large. It could be small. It could be something you recently made. Or it could be that very first real quilt that I made in 2014 that still needs to be quilted, bound and labeled. It could even be that finished quilt that still needs a label!

Sandra Bleicher has been in charge of UFO contracts in the past. To encourage us to finish those UFOs, we need to fill out the UFO form which is on our website and return half of the form to the chairperson. When we finish an item, we need to show it to the chairperson or bring it to a meeting for Show and Tell where we can all celebrate that it is finished. All completed UFOs are entered into a drawing at the end of the contract time (September meeting). If we don't finish that UFO by September? We pay the Guild whatever amount we pledged on our contract(s).

**SOV Food Bank:** Please remember to bring food to Shepherd of the Valley's food bank when you come to our meetings. Our rent for use of the meeting room and upstairs storage is reduced with the expectation that we will provide at least \$50 worth of food to the food bank each month. Attending members have been doing quite well with contributions. It would be wonderful for members who are not able to attend meetings, but still have the benefit of our space rental, to contribute occasionally. Ann puts a lunch box on the front table during meetings for donations that she then turns over to the church.

## **MINUTES TO 9-20-25 MEETING**

SEPTEMBER 20, 2025
DRAFT MINUTES

**PRESENT:** President Ann Lind, Secretary Dixie Alms, and Vice President Marcie Benvin. **Members:** Stephanie Allison, Nancy Krehlik, Sandra Bleicher, Cynthia Schmiege, Judy Morley, Karen Smith, Terry Bonnell, Genelle Massey, Karen Paulick, Sarah Smith, Nancy Slook, Jackie Swanson, Laurie Adamson, Louise Miller, Shannon Dilley, Loretta Mosley, Jackie Polasky, Marné Provost, Sandi Benzel, Christine Moleski, Dean Chantry and Krisi Selvig.

Quorum is 20.

President Ann called the meeting to order at 10:35 am.

**Minutes:** The minutes to the August 20<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved as corrected.

**Food Bank Donations**: Lunch box is looking good. The Food Bank crew left before Ann could get our money to them last month. She will add it to this month's amount. Please don't put your dues renewal in the lunch box.

**Treasurer's Report:** Recognizing that the budget year ends on September 30, I am not able to give a final budget-to-actual report for the whole financial year, but I do not anticipate much more activity except for the new year dues which are coming in.

We began the month of August with \$24,446.40 in the general fund. With income of \$11.18, and expenses of \$58.76, we ended the month of August with \$24,398.82.

Our Judy Hopkins Education Fund had \$6,110.03 at the end of July and with revenue of \$2.59 we ended the month of August with \$6,112.62 All funds at the end of August are in the bank with a balance of \$30,511.44

Our general revenue came in \$354.95 higher than budgeted, because we received a \$1,000 donation from the SE Radiation Oncology Center. Our membership dues came in short by \$585, due to less than anticipated membership enrollment. Our General Fund budget, not considering the Quilt Show budget which spans two financial years, ended August with a positive balance of \$171.52. The Community Outreach Programs budget, which is for Comfort Quilts & Pillowcases had a budget of \$2,000 but was overspent by \$902.42, due to a large purchase of Comfort Quilt backing. The Judy Hopkins Education Fund budget ended in the negative by \$49.94. This was due to the anticipation of 10% of revenues from Member Events & Activities like the Christmas Party, UFO Contracts, and Holiday Markets, and the sale of zipper pulls. We did not participate in Holiday Markets, so we did not bring in the anticipated revenue from that activity.

**Dues:** Membership dues must be paid by October 31<sup>st</sup> to prevent a lapse in membership. Dues must be paid by November 30<sup>th</sup> in order to enter anything in the May 2026 Quilt Show.

# **UNFINISHED BUSINESS and COMMITTEE REPORTS:** Education:

**1. Sampler Platter:** The Sampler Platter will be September 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> from 11-2 Alaska Time (3-6 Eastern Time). As soon as Ann receives the login information, she will send it out.

- **2. Robin Ruth Design:** Robin Long of Robin Ruth Designs will be in Juneau September 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2026 to teach a class on her method of Mariners Compass.
- 3. **Baby Crinkle book:** Mindy Henricksen and Ann Marie Martin will teach how to make a crinkle book after the November meeting.

**Comfort Quilts:** Judy Morley brought seven quilted tops that are ready to be bound. Three finished quilts were returned to her. She has seven or eight that are ready to quilt, and she sent three larger (regular to queen size) quilts to Cancer Connection. She needs a couple more larger quilts to send to them. Sandra Bleicher said Ruth Johnson wondered why they are getting such large quilts and said they don't really want quilts that big. Ruth expressed the same comments to Dixie early in September and said they usually get throw sized quilts from us. Sandra suggested Judy recheck with Ruth about the size needed for quilts.

**Pillowcases:** Shannon Dilley reported that Housing First took 11 pillowcases. AWARE and Johnson Center don't need any right now. The Pioneer Home hasn't returned Shannon's call; when they need some, they take 49. She will call them all again in November.

Christine Moleski took a box of pillowcase fabric to sew up a couple of months ago when we were working on them and found that the fabrics have been matched up but not ironed or trimmed for sewing. Her husband is bringing in the box.

Karen Paulick asked if the children are using the pillowcases for their belongings when the leave the AWARE center. She thought they might be embarrassed to carry their things in a pillowcase and suggested we might purchase some small suitcases for them. Shannon said the children have luggage. Sometimes the AWARE residents don't take the pillowcases with them; the staff washes and reuses them.

**UFO:** Sandra Bleicher said the UFO contract has ended. She will make her final report at the October meeting.

**Quilt Show:** Christine Moleski said they are looking for auction items and for things for the sales table. Items can be given to Christine, Sheila Box, Mindy Henricksen or Marcie Benvin. There are still a few pieces of the challenge fabric available if anyone is interested. The quilted item is to be no smaller than 12" x 12" and no larger than 18" x 18". Ann will choose the winner. (Krisi Selvig arrived.). The committee is working on sponsors, and Christine is taking donations today. The next Quilt Show meeting will be held here after our October membership meeting.

**Christmas Party:** Christine Moleski said the elves are working hard preparing for the Christmas Party. The committee is accepting donations for the raffles. If anyone has any ideas for games or for contests, please let Christine or Mindy Henricksen know. The party will be Saturday, December 6<sup>th</sup> from 2-4:30 pm at a place to be determined.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Election:** The slate of nominees for office for 2025-26 are as follows: Ann Lind, President; Marcie Benvin, Vice President; Sarah Smith, Secretary; and Stephanie Allison, Treasurer. Debbie Germain reported that the Board met on August 31<sup>st</sup> to discuss the fact that our nominee for treasurer has not been a Guild member for two years. The Board agreed to move forward with her nomination since no qualified member the nominating committee contacted

and no qualified member volunteered to run for the office. The policy regarding two year membership does not apply to the position of secretary. President Ann asked for nominations from the floor three times before announcing that nominations were closed. Dixie Alms moved and Shannon Dilley seconded a motion to cast a unanimous ballot for the slate of nominees. The slate of nominees was unanimously elected.

As Marcie left to go back to work, she commented that she and Ann are term limited (lame ducks) this year. She said that we need people to step up for these positions. Debbie added that if you might be interested, you might want to work with a board member to see what they do. Feel out the position. We have a checklist of duties for each position on the website; none of these positions is that hard. Ann encouraged members to talk to the board member in the position of interest.

Comfort quilt expenses: Debbie Germain brought up that we talked about purchasing additional backing fabric during the June meeting. Ann didn't have a quote for the amount and was working with a fabric rep in order to buy it wholesale. After getting the bill, we realized how far out of line we were with the budget. Debbie asked forgiveness for our lapse and asked for approval for the excess \$978.25. Ann said the reason we went so over budget was that Judy needed a few colors. When Ann learned that the fabric line was being discontinued, she bought 10 bolts of the subtle pattern/colors that we were using rather than buying something loud and ugly. She said as a wholesaler, she received 50% off the shipping. Karen Paulick moved and Terry Bonnell seconded a motion to approve the \$978.25 expense. Unanimous approval.

**BIRTHDAYS:** Krisi Selvig is the only September birthday here today.

#### FOR THE GOOD OF THE ORDER:

**Comfort quilt and pillowcase kit** tubs have been brought downstairs. Please help yourself to some community service projects. Shannon suggested we take two pillowcase kits. She has found some of the fabric rough and probably not comfortable to sleep on.

**Karen Paulick** thanked Sarah Smith for her work on the website. She said it looks fresher and more modern. She encouraged everyone to look at it.

**Sandra Bleicher** has two youth kuspuk patterns to give away. She took the box of pillowcase fabric that needs to ironed and trimmed. We will work on it at Open Sew at RainTree on Thursdays and Fridays.

Sandi Benzel has old Viking feet and more for anyone who has a machine it will fit.

**Krisi Selvig** has patterns to give away.

**Ann** welcomed people to put their give-aways on the table in the back but asked them to take their give aways with them if there are no takers. It was also suggested that the Christmas Party raffles or the Quilt Show sales table might be a good place for some of the items.
